Commencement Speaker | Stefen Wisniewski



A 2010 graduate of the Penn State College of Education with a degree in secondary education, **Stefen Wisniewski** was an offensive lineman in the National Football League for 10 seasons. He played for the Kansas City Chiefs, Pittsburgh Steelers, Philadelphia Eagles, Jacksonville Jaguars and Oakland Raiders after being drafted 48th overall in 2011. He

played in three Super Bowls, winning two – LII and LIV with Philadelphia and Kansas City, respectively.

Before being drafted into the NFL, Wisniewski played football for the Penn State Nittany Lions. He was a part of the 2008 Big Ten Championship team that played in the 2009 Rose Bowl, and the 2009 Capital One Bowl winning team. He was a first team AFCA all-American 2010, and an ESPN Academic All-American in 2008, 2009 and 2010.

During his senior football season at Penn State, Wisniewski simultaneously taught English at State College Area High School through the full-year Professional Development School program, and he was a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, also known as the "Academic Heisman."

While he has not taught formally in a classroom since graduating, Wisniewski said he uses what he learned while studying education often when he teaches the sport of football at camps and practices, and when he teaches the Bible during sermons and Bible studies. Now retired from the NFL, Wisniewski is pursuing a Master of Divinity degree from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary; he plans to begin a career in Christian pastoral ministry.

College Student Marshal | Nate Gillespie

The College of Education has selected **Nate Gillespie** to serve as student marshal for Penn State's spring 2022 Commencement ceremony, which will be held at 9 a.m. Sunday, May 8, at the Pegula Ice Arena. Stephanie Hopkins has served as his academic advisor.

From Spring Mills, Pennsylvania, Gillespie is graduating with a 4.0 GPA, with a bachelor of science in secondary education English, and a minor in creative writing. He also is a Schreyer Honors College scholar. His thesis paper covered the ways in which standardized testing and tracking

perpetuate inequity in U.S. schools, and advocated for reform of the current system.

"Being selected as the College of Education student marshal is a great honor," Gillespie said. "It's very rewarding to have the hard work and dedication that I've put into my time at Penn State be recognized in this way. This is a testament to my family and the values that they've instilled in me and I'm grateful for everything that they've done to help me to get to this point. Overall, I'm just appreciative of this opportunity."

During his college career, Gillespie earned the President's Freshman Award in 2019, the President Sparks Award in 2020 and the Evan Pugh Scholar Award in 2021 and 2022. He also was named an Academic Excellence Scholar by the Schreyer Honors College, and was a recipient of the Paul D. & Rev. David P. Wentroble Scholarship, presented by the College of Education for



demonstrating good character and academic achievement; the Hedgebeth Honors Scholarship in Education, given to provide academic recognition and financial assistance to Schreyer Scholars in the College of Education; the Ready to Succeed Scholarship, awarded by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency to highachieving students; and an Alumni Association Scholarship.

He was active in multiple organizations including the Penn State Speech and Debate Team, the Apollo THON organization and the Schreyer

Honors College Student Council. He also was a Black Lives Matter At School Week of Action educator. His experience includes student teaching 11th-grade English at State College Area High School, and working as a student staff coordinator for New Student Orientation at Penn State and as a Penn State Science outreach assistant

After graduation, Gillespie plans to pursue an English teaching position and later obtain a law or graduate degree. He stated he is committed to "help shape learners who are empowered to use their voice to promote justice and change they want to see in their world, are engaged in democracy, and believe in themselves."

Gillespie's parents, Bob and Carrie Gillespie, along with his siblings, grandmothers, and girlfriend, Gaby, plan to attend the ceremony.

Education and Public Policy

This degree prepares students to enter professional careers in educational organizations, government, community development, public service, nonprofits, consulting, philanthropy, and interest groups for the betterment of a diverse and democratic society.

Elementary and Early Childhood Education

This degree prepares candidates to teach children in preschool through fourth grade.

Middle Level Education

This degree prepares candidates to teach all subjects in grades four to six and Mathematics, English or Social Studies in grades seven and eight.

Rehabilitation and Human Services

This degree prepares candidates for a variety of positions in rehabilitation, mental health, welfare, and employment services or for graduate work in the helping professions.

Secondary Education

This degree prepares candidates for teaching positions related to their content areas in grades 7-12. Candidates pursue one or more of the following teaching options: Biological Science, Chemistry, Earth and Space Science, English, Mathematics, Physics, and Social Studies.

Special Education

This degree prepares candidates for teaching individuals with special learning needs, at any age or ability level.

Workforce Education and Development

This degree prepares candidates to teach a specific trade or skill in a vocational-technical school, trade school, or community college, or to coordinate or supervise in a vocational education setting. Candidates choose from three options: Health Occupations Education, Industrial Education, or Occupational Home Economics Education, all of which lead to a teacher certificate; or a non-certificate Industrial Training option. Each degree candidate has also shown competency in their respective trade or skill.

World Languages Education

This degree prepares candidates for K-12 teaching positions or other employment fields related to their content language area, which may be French, German, Latin or Spanish.
